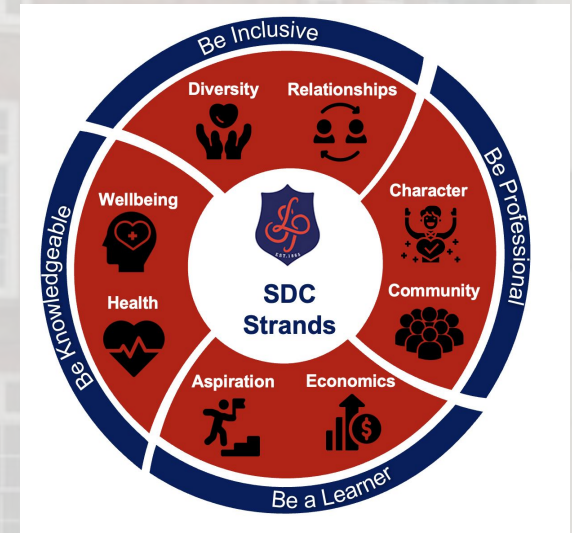

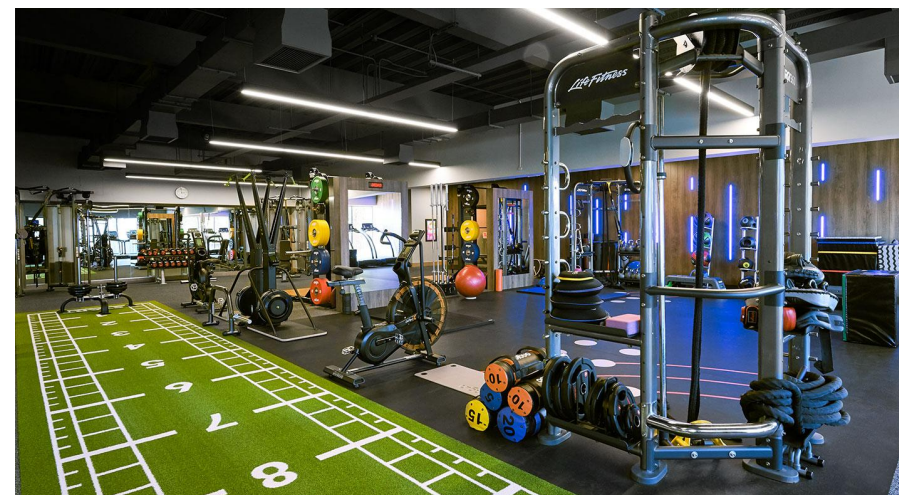


Breakfast Club

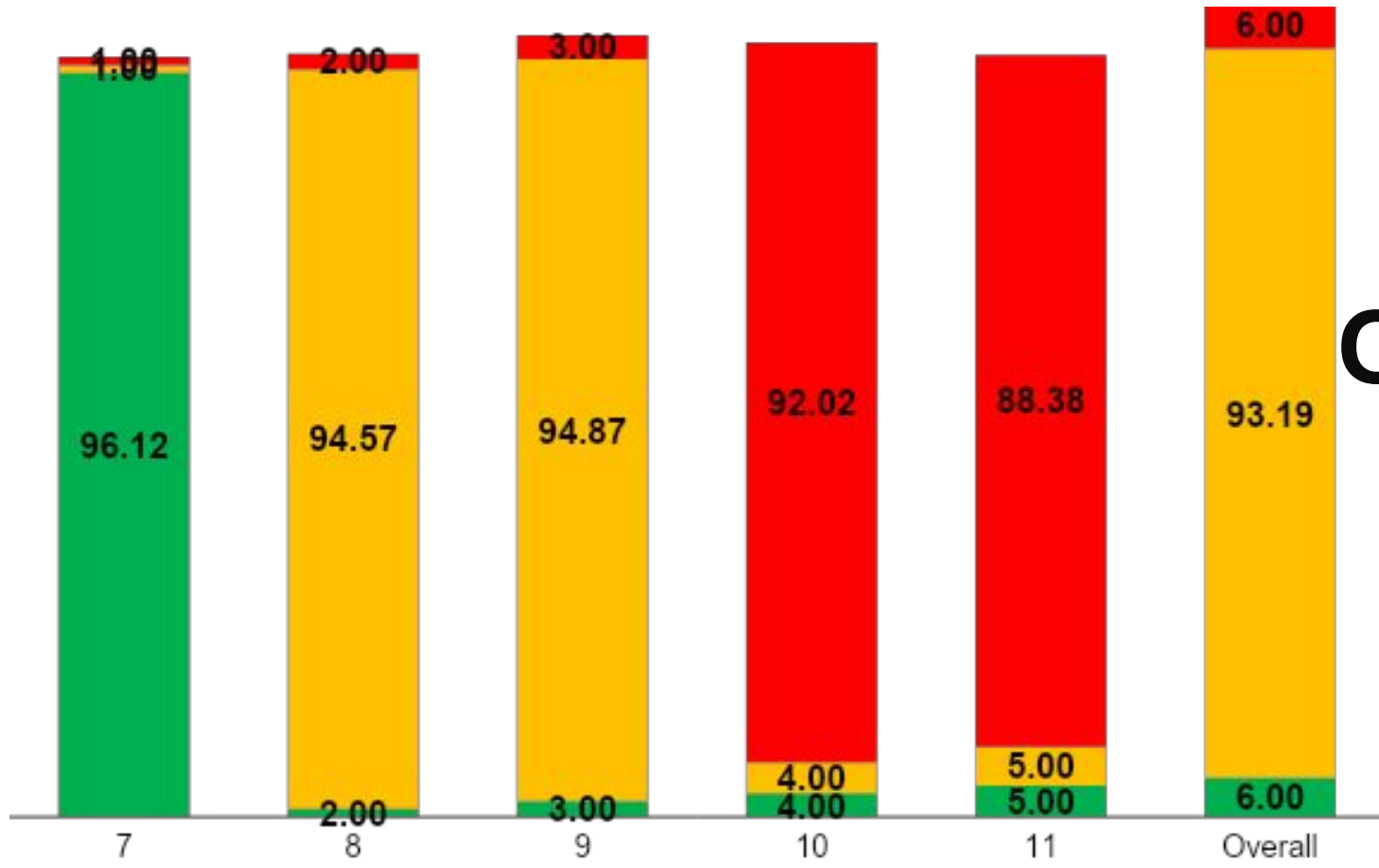

The Equality Act (2010) says you must not be discriminated against because: you are (or are not) of a particular religion or that you hold (or do not hold) a particular philosophical belief.

People with a religion are generally paid less than those with no religion

The average earnings for people of particular religions/beliefs in 2013 were: **£10.70** for people with no religion; **£10.50** for Christians; and **£9.80** for religious minorities. Hindus (**£11.70**) and Jewish people (**£16.20**) were the two religious groups that had higher earnings than those with no religion in 2013.




Discuss:

Using the statistics and facts below, what are the different ways faith-based discrimination manifests itself in society?

How might subtle forms of discrimination be just as harmful as more obvious forms like hate crimes?

People with no religion are less worried about crime but more likely to report being the victim of a violent crime

People with no religion were less worried about crime. In England, Muslims (**67.8%**), Buddhists (**67.1%**), Hindus (**66.4%**), Sikhs (**61.6%**) and Christians (**38.6%**) were more likely to report feeling worried about physical attack and acquisitive crime than those with no religion (**32.3%**) in 2012/13. In Scotland, worry about crime was higher for people



Christians and Muslims are less likely to have a degree-level qualification than Buddhists, Sikhs, Jewish people, Hindus, or people with no religion



In Britain, 31.2% of people with no religion had a degree-level qualification in 2013. A lower percentage of Christians (**25.2%**) and Muslims (**28.0%**) had a degree-level qualification. However, Buddhist (**39.8%**), Hindu (**53.2%**), Jewish (**54.0%**) and Sikh (**32.4%**) people were more likely to have a degree-level qualification, compared with those with no religion in 2013.



Greatest Rise in Reported Anti-Muslim Hate Cases to Tell MAMA since Oct 7th

(Tell MAMA has recorded a **335%** increase in anti-Muslim hate cases, comparing the last 4 months to those in 2022/2023)
